
British Alpines on the ascendancy!

HERD DIARY

My name is Lindsay Greer. I live near Bainbridge, County Down, Northern Ireland. I own the Taitstown herd of British Alpines which I have been breeding for thirty years. In my herd at the moment I have three milkers, Taitstown Nicole, Taitstown Akeelah and Taitstown Claire, one female kid, Taitstown Tina, who is a daughter of Nicole. I have two males at stud, Bartrams Rooney and Ardross Wayne.

I had the great pleasure this year of making Taitstown Nicole Breed Champion. She is the first female British Alpine Breed Champion anywhere in Ireland.

As a goatling I showed Nicole at seven shows. She got seven firsts and five best goatling and 1 reserve. As a first kidder this year I showed her at five shows. She got five firsts, five breed challenge certificates, her Q* and one IP. I am really proud that she is now a Breed Champion.

1st November: I had a visit today from a new goatkeeper who has just imported some British Alpines from Enid Crook's and Sandy Stevenson's herds. He wanted to see my British Alpines and I think he was impressed.

 2^{nd} November: Had a few friends over tonight for a meal and a few glasses of Jamesons – you can't beat it.

3rd November: Attended Northern Ireland Goat Club AGM where I received a trophy for winning a milking competition with Taitstown Nicole – after the meeting we all enjoyed a very good lunch.

5th November: Checking on goats this

morning as I am still waiting for Nicole and Claire to come into season. It is getting late for the early shows. Akeelah was mated on 4th October.

7th November: Still no sign of the two goats coming into season.

9th November: Went to feed store today to get my weeks supply of feed, it does not get any cheaper. The milkers get a 20% protein ration, the youngstock and males 15%.

12th November: Still no sign of goat in season.

13th November: At last Claire in season. Mated her with Ardross Wayne.

15th November: Brilliant, Nicole in season. Mated her with Bartrams Rooney. Today is the last day otherwise she would have missed the Royal Ulster Show (Balmoral).

 16^{th} November: Forgot the electric was off today from 8.30 am until 4.30 pm – a long day!

19th November: Had to go and get more hay today. I am lucky that I have a supply of good quality hay which the goats need as I zero graze all year round, although I still get fairly good milk yields with butterfats between 5% and 6%.

20th November Another trip to feed store to get more feed plus sugar beet.

21st November: Taitstown Hope back

with me today for mating but not in season yet, so she is staying here for a while. I sold Hope earlier in the year to another British Alpine breeder. I had the great privilege of winning the Foxbrigge Trophy with Hope two years ago. The Trophy is presented by the British Alpine Breed Society for the milker with the highest points at any BGS show (BA milker that is).

24th November: Had phone call today from BA breeder from way down in Athlone wanting to bring up a goatling to use on my male.

27th November: Visit to Health Centre to get check up on my no smoking – which is very very tough. Get a telling off from the nurse as well.

30th November: Its been a very quiet month goat wise apart from matings.

I hope this diary has not bored you too much. Good luck with all your kidding next year.

Sadly Elaine pasted away on November 18th. after a short time in hospital. Life Member of both the B.G.S.& A.N.B.S Best known for AN's but for a few years also had Swiss type FB - HB goats, with the latter using Mostyn males in her upgrading.

Her foundation AN was Wayward Gloxinia, bought from Margaret Edginton, who had inherited this herd from Miss Lupton in 1975. Elaine's bloodlines mostly came from this renowned herd, with the occasional Berkham male added.

A very active member of the A.N.B.S. committee for many years..I'm sure a lot of showing goatkeeper will remember her for the excellent job she undertook on behalf of our Society (doing so for many years), as Chief Steward for the Breed Shows, when they were in their heydays at Stoneleigh. This task Elaine did with utmost proficiency she also ran shows for Worcester Goat Society where she was a founder member.

The Olchontop prefix was registered in 1979. I had great pleasure in knowing Elaine for the past 30+ years. Her prefix came from the Olchon Valley where her husband once lived, which is on the Welsh borders, Hereford side of the Black Mountains.

Dear All,

We had a very interesting paper by Angel Ortiz Pelaez at our autumn meeting, at which he outlined a project which he and his colleagues at AHVLA have begun, along with colleagues from the Roslin Institute.

For some years now, genes have been known in sheep which confer resistance to Scrapie, and this knowledge has been used to breed scrapie resistant flocks which are seen as a valuable step on the way hopefully to the eradication of the disease. Until recently, no similar genes had been found in goats, but recently two such genes have been identified, and the object of the project is to survey goats in Britain to get a feel for the occurrence of these genes in them, and thus to see if this might be a useful basis for generating a reservoir of Scrapie resistant goats.

To do that Angel is looking for about 100 herd owners who would be willing to have some of their goats blood sampled to see if any of them carry either or both of these genes. There would be no charge for the sampling, and a certificate will be provided for each goat that is found to be carrying one of the resistant genes.

To take part you will need a minimum of 10 goats on the holding. All male goats would be sampled, and does would be sampled in addition to make up to a maximum of 30 samples per herd. The object initially is to survey 2000 goats in all.



Research into Scrapie is being done with a high degree of international cooperation, with results being compared and coordinated, and this is one of several surveys which are being carried out in various countries. The results will be extremely interesting, and could potentially be of great value.

SPREADING THE WORD.

You may be aware of some of the on-line chat-rooms devoted to goats. On one of these, Goaty Friends (the clue is in the name) there has recently has been some discussion of shows and spreading the word generally.

Apart from worries about a decrease in shows there was also an anxiety about the shortage of one day shows which allowed people to exhibit in a less formal way then at the large agricultural shows. I know that these do still exist but often they are only publicised in a very limited area. If you know of any such shows it would be helpful if you could let me know and we can start of list which would be useful to people wanting access to such shows.

Shows tend to be much more sympathetic to providing space for goats if there is some information provided for the public at the same time. A manned stand is ideal but often impractical but there are other possibilities; the BGS has attractive pull-up banners which can be borrowed and are located in various regions and are easy to transport. There are also information leaflets which were produced some years ago but are being revised. More recently I have produced a four page leaflet of basic goat-keeping information. It is quite detailed although really aimed at children (and is supposedly written by kids –the four legged type) but it is up-to-date other than SBV. It is not a BGS publication but I can send a link to allow it to be down-loaded. Any or all of these things can be put together to make a display.

So for 2013 can we:

Help to publicise one day shows and try to get goats into more of them. This may involve sharing information. Please let me know of any you know. Try to get information about goats into more venues.
